The Polytechnic campus is a technical and innovative partner within the enterprising East Valley, set in a peaceful desert landscape.




- common recreation and study areas, and community kitchens
- special programming and events for residence hall community members

## Security features

### ASU makes campus safety a priority

ASU is committed to providing all students with a safe campus environment by offering services and resources to keep you secure on and around campus.

### Secure residence halls

A student ID card is required to enter ASU residence halls, and residents must escort their guests at all times. Front desks are staffed 24 hours a day.

### ASU Alert system

Through text messages or emails, you can be instantly alerted to situations — both urgent and less serious — on or near campus.

### Emergency call boxes

Located throughout all ASU campuses and parking structures, emergency call boxes connect directly to the ASU Police Department.

### LiveSafe app

This mobile app can be used to call for emergency assistance, send police anonymous tips or have a friend virtually walk you home.

### Safety escorts

If you're studying or working late on campus, you can request an escort home and a specially trained volunteer will accompany you.

### ASU Police

The ASU Police Department is a full-service, 24-hour campus police force.



## Admission requirements

### For undergraduates (bachelor's)

**Freshman students** must have a minimum 3.00 GPA from secondary school (4.00="A").

**Transfer students** must have a minimum 2.50 GPA from their college or university.

Some ASU programs may have higher admission requirements.

### English proficiency requirements\*

Test scores are required from one of the following:

- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL): minimum 61 (iBT)
- International English Language Testing System (IELTS): minimum 6.0
- Pearson Test of English (PTE): minimum 53

Note: Ira A. Fulton Schools of Engineering requires a minimum 79 TOEFL (iBT), 6.5 IELTS or 58 PTE for undergraduate programs.

\*Some programs require higher English proficiency scores.

### For graduates (master's)

International applicants must have the equivalent of a U.S. bachelor's degree or higher, from an officially recognized institution.

Applicants must have maintained a minimum 3.00 GPA in the last 60 semester hours or 90 quarter hours of undergraduate coursework (4.00="A").

Each academic department has the option of requiring test scores, letters of recommendation and other supporting documents. Type of undergraduate coursework completed may also be considered. ### English proficiency requirements\*

Test scores are required from one of the following:

- TOEFL: minimum 80 (iBT)
- IELTS: minimum 6.5
- PTE: minimum 60

\*Some programs require higher English proficiency scores.

### Official transcripts

Submit your high school transcripts and transcripts from any college or university you attended, in the original language and with an official English translation.

### How to apply to ASU

1. Complete the application for admission [kaplanpathways.com/asu-apply](http://kaplanpathways.com/asu-apply)
2. Send official transcripts, academic records and test scores.
3. Provide evidence of English language proficiency.
4. Submit your financial guarantee and other supporting documents.

## Cost of attendance

The cost of attendance is the estimated cost of completing a full year as a full-time student. Costs will vary depending on course requirements and personal spending habits.

### Scholarships

ASU offers generous scholarships to high-achieving international students. Scholarships awards are deducted from a student's tuition costs.

No separate application is required – all applicants are considered for a scholarship at point of admission.

### Research and work experience

As a graduate student at ASU, you can play an important role working alongside professors on meaningful research projects. F-1 visa students can also take part in Optional Practical Training and gain experience in their fields by spending up to 36 months working off campus after graduation.
